



IF YOUR RIGHTS ARE VIOLATED

If your civil rights have been violated or you are a victim of misconduct by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), you can file a complaint.

Know Your Rights

- Right to remain silent
- Right to speak with a legal representative
- Right to see a warrant signed by a judge

Document What You See

Remember to:

- Record or have others record what is happening.
- Write down what happened after ICE has left. You may be able to use this evidence when filing a report.
 - How many ICE agents were present (inside and outside)?
 - How were the agents dressed?
 - How were they armed?
 - Did the agents make you or others believe you could not move or leave?
 - Did the agents mistreat anyone? If so, how?

Violations of Your Rights

Examples of misconduct and violation of rights include:

- Police brutality, use of excessive force, searched and arrested under false pretenses including racial or other discriminatory profiling.
- Inappropriately asked to provide immigration information in the workplace.
- Denied rights when arrested or detained.
- Physical attack or threats of violence based on race, color, national origin, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or disability.
- Denied admission into educational program or activity or harassment based on race, sex, national origin, disability, or religion.
