



MIRA Coalition 2026 video Call For Proposals

MIRA Coalition is seeking proposals from professional videographers to create a 3-5 minute video to be showcased at our annual fundraiser, featured on our website and used in our communications materials.

Scope of Work

Develop ideas based on concept and guidance provided by MIRA

Work closely with MIRA's Communications Department to record interviews, film on location at at least 2 events (MIRA's Spring conference **TBD in March** and Immigrants' Day at the State House **Also in March TBD**)

Video editing and music; finding any additional necessary footage

Provide final 3-5 minute full length video file, plus 3 one minute clips for promotional use, and all extra footage not used in final edited video files

April 23, 2025 deadline for full length video, to be followed by 3 rounds of revision/approval

May 11, 2025 deadline for final approved package

Desired Qualifications:

- Professional videography experience and portfolio
- Experience working with dynamic and impactful small-medium size organizations (~\$3 million budget)
- Experience working with organizations with BIPOC and immigrant staff, board, and members and serving BIPOC, immigrant and historically underserved populations
- Desire to take the time to get to know who MIRA is
- Documentary and/or interview experience a plus
- Lived immigrant experience a plus
- Willingness to work with extremely tight budget restraints (we are a smallish non-profit)
